The Ontario Police Department is looking for individuals seeking a career in law enforcement with professional advancement. We are seeking to employ Police Officers who are self-disciplined, self-motivated and work well in a team environment. Applicants must be able to communicate effectively, both verbally and in writing. Job duties include enforcing the law while protecting the constitutional rights of all. The Ontario Police Department seeks committed individuals who want to work with a diverse citizenry in improving our quality of life. Those who qualify will receive exciting career opportunities and extensive benefits.

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS

Applicants must be able to meet all Oregon DPSST requirements for certification. This includes, but is not limited to: high school diploma or GED, be 21 years or older at the time of employment, U.S. citizen with valid drivers license. Must be able to pass DPSST physical agility test unless you are a current Oregon Certified Police Officer. Applicants must be able to pass a reading and writing proficiency test or provide proof of prior testing. Applicants must also be able to pass an extensive background search.

Applicants must be available to work rotating shifts, weekends, and holidays as needed and pass a thorough background investigation. Felony convictions and disqualifying criminal histories are not allowed. Applicants must successfully complete psychological and medical evaluation prior to employment.

RESPONSIBILITIES

Applicants must be a Certified Police Officer or have the ability to complete the Oregon Department of Public Safety Standards and Training Police Academy. Upon completion of the academy, you will perform law enforcement and crime prevention work including patrol and investigation. You will enforce federal, state and local laws and provide public information and education activities. This work may involve personal risk and requires sound, independent judgment in all situations

TERMS OF EMPLOYMENT

Salary is \$4,473.73 per month plus paid overtime, incentive pay for bilingual, certifications and field training. Starting Salary may be increased for prior years of certified service.
