



Fall Cleanup Program

The City's Annual Fall Cleanup Program is scheduled in November the week before Thanksgiving. Citizens may place leaves, branches, garden plants, and other yard debris on the curbside; City crews will come by and pick it up.

John Bishop, Public Works Operations Manager, would like to inform citizens that the Fall Cleanup is the only annual cleanup the City conducts. To participate in the program residents need to bag, box, or bundle their leaves and yard debris, and place them on the curb. This is to prevent them from blowing around in the street and eventually blocking drainage basins. It is also requested that you limit the weight of each bag, box or bundle to 50 pounds as our maintenance crews physically lift each bag into a loader bucket or dump truck.

As in the past, maintenance crews will follow the normal garbage pickup routes of Ontario Sanitary Service to the best of their ability beginning in the Northwest end of Ontario and continuing through the city. The refuse is taken to a landfill and ground into compost; therefore, batteries, tires and other refuse, which will not decompose, will not be picked up.
