INFORMATION TO APPLICANT - PLEASE READ CAREFULLY BEFORE SIGNING.

Upon signing this Application, Applicant authorizes the City of Ontario to conduct a full criminal and financial background investigation and to obtain such other information as the City Recorder or Police Chief may require.

Upon receipt of any application as provided by Ontario City Code, the Chief of Police and Fire Chief may cause an investigation to be made of the Applicant and his/her proposed operation.

If, as a result of such investigation, the character or business responsibility of the Applicant is found to be unsatisfactory, the Chief of Police and Fire Chief shall endorse on the Application his disapproval and his reasons for the same and he shall notify the Applicant that his application is disapproved and that no license or permit may be issued.

If, as a result of the investigation, the character or business responsibility of the Applicant are found to be satisfactory, the Chief of Police shall endorse on the application his approval and return the approved original application to the City Recorder, who, upon receipt of the license fee, shall deliver the license to the Applicant.

The license shall contain the signature of the issuing officer and shall show the name and address of the licensee, the type of goods to be sold thereunder, the amount of fee paid, the date of issuance, and the length of time the license is in effect. The City Recorder shall keep a record of all licenses issued.

NOTICE TO APPLICANT UPON APPROVAL

Any permit issued under 3-8 of the Ontario City Code may be revoked or any application for issuance of a permit may be refused for any of the following causes:

- a) The application submitted by the applicant or permit holder contains any false fraudulent or misleading statement;
- b) Fraud, misrepresentation or false statements made in the course of carrying on the licensed activity;
- c) A violation of said Section 3-8 of the Ontario City Code;
- d) Conviction of any crime or misdemeanor involving moral turpitude;
- e) Conducting the licensed activity in an unlawful manner or in such a manner as to constitute a menace to the health, safety or general welfare of the public; or
- f) In the opinion of the City Manager, the criterion for issuance of a permit has not been met.

Any person conducting any such sale or similar activity without being properly licensed therefore or who shall violate any of the other terms and regulations of Section 3-8 of the Ontario City Code shall, upon conviction, be punished as provided in Section 1-4-1 of the Ontario City Code.

ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS/PROVISIONS

No permittee whose permit has been revoked shall make further application until a period of at least six (6) months shall have elapsed since the last previous revocation. 3-8-2.10

Sales shall be limited in time to no more than the daylight hours (unless approved otherwise) of the dates specified in the permit issued by the City in accordance with the issuance period for this permit.

The property offered for sale may be displayed within those areas designated in the permit authorizing such sale. No property offered for sale at such a sale shall be displayed in any public right of way.

Only the following specified signs may be displayed in relation to a pending transient merchant sale:

- a) Two (2) signs of not more than four (4) square feet shall be permitted to be displayed on the property of the location where the sale is being conducted.
- b) Two (2) signs of not more than two (2) square feet each are permitted; provided, that the premises upon which the sale is conducted is not on a major thoroughfare, and written permission to erect said signs is received from the property owners upon whose property such signs are to be placed.
- c) None of the aforesaid signs shall be placed in public right of way property.
- d) No sign or other form of advertisement shall be exhibited for more than two (2) days prior to the day such sale is to commence.
- e) All signs must be removed within twenty-four (24) hours of the termination of the sale.

The individual to whom a sale permit is issued and the owner or tenant of the premises upon which sale or activity is conducted, shall be jointly and severally responsible for the maintenance of good order and decorum on the premises during all hours of such sale or activity. No such individual shall permit any loud or boisterous conduct on said premises nor permit vehicles to impede the passage of traffic on any roads or streets in the area of such premises. All such individuals shall obey the reasonable orders of any member of the Ontario Police or Fire Departments in order to maintain the public health, safety and welfare and shall maintain the sales area and property in a clean and orderly condition at all times.

A police officer or any other official designed by any City ordinance to make inspections under the licensing or regulating provisions of the City or to enforce the same, shall have the right of entry to any premises showing evidence of a garage sale or flea market for the purpose of enforcement or inspection and may close the premises from such a sale or arrest any individual who violates the provisions of Section 3-8 of the Ontario City Code.

All parking of vehicles shall be conducted in compliance with all applicable laws and regulations. Further, the Ontario Police Department may enforce such temporary controls to alleviate any special hazards and/or congestion created by any garage sale or flea market.
